

The Wichita Wildlight Photographic Society of Lawton presents: "The Best of Southwest Oklahoma"-- a slide show of more than 1200 photographs of our area taken by the 30 best photographers in Oklahoma. The show features images of every aspect of our beautiful part of the state including landscapes, wildlife, cultural events, architecture, & much more. Images were



taken in all seasons of the year & display scenes from ice-covered buffalo to the beautiful flower-covered hillsides of the Refuge in the Spring. Many of the wildlife images were taken by world-class, award-winning wildlife photographers who live in Lawton. The show runs in a continuous loop lasting more than 3 hours, then repeats. There are enough images that a casual viewer might never see the same image twice. It is a celebration of the beauty of Oklahoma.

DATABASE SPOTLIGHT: FOLD3

Your first source for historic military records, Fold3 provides access to US records that include stories, photos, & personal documents of the men & women who served. Also available



are historic documents for African Americans, Native Americans including the Dawes Roll, Dawes Roll application files & the annual Indian census rolls (1885-1940, by agency), historical newspapers, US. Census records, U.S. naturalization records, city directories, FBI case files, & many other documents of the past. Many of these records are exclusive to Fold3.

The types of military records found include Revolutionary War & War of 1812 Pension Records, Mexican War Service Records, a plethora of Civil War records (such as muster rolls. rosters, payrolls, hospital & prison registers, prison & rolls, & Confederate amnesty papers rolls), World War I & II records, an interactive Vietnam Veterans Memorial, & the Army Register of Enlistments 1798-1914.
